

Omaha Drops a Game to Lincoln; Big Out-of-town Entry for the Local Tennis Tournament

WITH NINE HITS OMAHA LOSES

Slats Davis and Foot Team Work Gives Lincoln Game 2 to 1.

COLLISION COSTS OMAHA RUN

Lawler, Overanxious to Get King's Fly, Throws Wreck and Helps Slats Davis with His Course Work.

Lincoln, 1; Omaha, 1.

Nine hits were made by the Rouke family Thursday afternoon and yet both sides reached shatters to the rare judgment of Slats Davis, who took the winning run away from Omaha at the home plate when Beiden was clearly safe, with Ziran on the other side of the sack. Several times Omaha had a chance to win the game but which that afternoon time, but on each occasion when the big chance was presented the Omaha batters fell down and it was the heavy hitters of the Omaha team at that. Three times Chickie Autrey had a chance to drive in the lead, but he was out on the base when he struck out in an effort to sacrifice Red to third and Autrey and Welch failed to deliver.

Red Fisher was there with his driver and made three kinds of drives, the first a two-sacker, the second a straight single and the third a home which he beat out with half the Lincoln team trying to head him off. The trouble was that there was never anyone ahead of him to cross the plate and the boys back of him were not hitting. In the opening round he hit for a double, with the King soon struck out in an effort to sacrifice Red to third and Autrey and Welch failed to deliver.

Where Omaha Got It.

Omaha made the first run in the fourth inning, when Welch led off with a hit, which was sacrificed to second by Autrey, and after Beiden had walked and Lawler went out to Gallagher, Goding made the hit which scored Welch. Beiden tried to come on home on the throw from left field and was clearly safe, but Slats Davis ruled that he was out. James Austin had the real hard luck story in the second inning. He beat out a bunt and on the first ball pitched solo second and on the next ball pitched solo third and there he died, his teammates refusing to come to his assistance. Then in the fifth Fisher, singled after Hall had struck out. King's single put Fisher on third, but he was nailed at the plate when Chickie hit to Pritchett.

Lincoln tied the score in the sixth inning, although it looked like they had a chance to win in the second. With one out Hall passed Pritchett and Wenger and hit Kelley, filling the bases. Ziran was at bat and he was expected to win the game right there, but the game was not doomed to be lost at that stage. Ziran hit a liner over the head of Hall and over second, but little King seemed to have wings and pulled down the fly and throwing the ball to Lawler, completed a nice double.

Lincoln's Big Kick Helps. In the sixth, Hall made the mistake of walking Fox, who was followed by Gagner with a safe bunt. Davidson struck out, but St. Louis Jack Thomas hit safe and scored Fox.

The winning run was made in the eighth inning, and was due in a large measure to Lawler's error. Fox had bopped one to Autrey and died when Gagner popped another back to the pitcher's box. Several players ran for the ball, which was clearly King's. King kept calling that the ball was his, but Lawler evidently did not hear him, and they collided and Gagner was safe. Davidson flew out to Fisher, and Thomas got in a safe one to left. Pritchett followed with a lucky hit to right, on which Gagner scored his winning run. Lincoln won the game with six hits against nine for Omaha.

The Houke family is at Lincoln today and Saturday, and back for a double-header with Lincoln Sunday.
