

Session. Every state in the union, with the excepion of North Dakota, Nevada and Wyoming, and the District of Columbia, Hawaii and Porto Rico, were represented in the university, which closed on August 15. It was the most successful segulon since its of which 1.498 were located up on Morningside, the rest being at the College of Physiclans and Surgeons. In addition there were right students from Canada, six from China, and others from Australia. Chile, Cuba, Costa Rica, England, freiand, Japan, Mexico and Russia. Of the total number of students at the

university this summer there were 634 who vere matriculated in the following schools. he others taking courses without matrice lating for a degree: Columbia college, 57 Barnard. 25: schools of engineering, 125, fine arts, 2: political science, 22: philosphy, 15%; pure science, 57; Teachers' college, 145; and Physicians and Surgeons, 2. The number of men and women was practically equal, there being 761 men and 771 women. New students numbered 871, and old students 661. There were 491 students bolding 003 degrees, the great majority having degrees of A. B. or H. S., and they were given by 166 different colleges or universiies here and abroad.

New York state led the list of students with 722, of which 572 were from the greater city. Next in point of number was New Jersey, with 129, and then came Pennylvania, with 76; Maryland, 51; Ohio, 45; ndiana and Massachusetts, 32 each; Georgia, 21; Connecticut, and Illinois, 25 each: North Carolina, 23; South Carolina and Virgine, 20 each; District of Columbia, 19; Michigan. 18; Kentucky and Missouri. 5 each? Alabama, 18; Californi, 12; Texas and Florida, 11 each; Iowa and Nebraska, 16 each; Tennessee and West Virginia, each, and Minnesota and Washington.

Vice Presidents Who Have Reached the Presidency.

PECULIAR FEATURES OF RECORD

Death Promoted Five to the Execu tive Office-Brief Summary of Party History and Leadership.

The vice president of the United Status has two functions to perform-he presides over the senste and succeeds to the prestdent's office, should it be varated by death or disability, by impeachment or by resignation. As heir to the presidency. he must possess the same qualifications as the president. He must be a nativoen citizen of the United States, 35 years of use and have been for fourteen years resident within the United States. chosen at the same time, in the same manner and by the same electors as the president. In view of the fact that five of the twenty-five men who have been elected president have died during their term of office, thus permitting five men who had been elected to the second placto reach the first, it would seem that much care would be given to the selection of the vice presidential candidate In practice this has not been so. Two of the vice presidents slevated to the chief magistracy through the death of pred dents have signally discomfitted the party to which they owed their office by or posing its policies.

Of the five each chertshed the natural ambition to succeed himself in the regular manner. But of them all only one. Then dore Roosevelt, has realize the ambition Successes and Failures.

John Tyler of Virginia and Andrew

Johnson of Tennessee had too flagrantly opposed the parties which elected them presidents to hope for a nomination to the higher office. Chester A Arthur. nominated with James A. Garfield to soothe Roscoe Conkling's disappointment in not securing a third term nomination for General Grant, hoped for commendation, but failed to win it. Millard Fillmore and Theodore Roosevelt received the presidential nomination through the regular channels, but Fillmore fuiled of election. But one man, first made president through the death of his predecessor, has later been elected to the office. Other presidents have, however, served as vice provident before reaching the higher office. John Adams, vice president while George Washington presided as chief exemitive, succeeded Washington to the high office.

He was in his turn succeeded by his vice president. Thomas Jefferson. All drew Jackson, who called the first demo-W. N. Watson will return to Lincoln the cratic national convention in order that it might nominate Martin Van Buren as vice president on the democratic licket with him, practically named Van Buren as his successor. These three, with the five who succeeded through the accident of death, make a total of eight vice presidonig who liave ascended to the president dency.

President Tyler and His Title. General Harrison's cubinet had decided hat Tyler's official title should be "vice. president of the United States, acting president." But he decided otherwise and declared himself, as he was, president by

right of the constitution. All the cabinet excepting Daniel Webster resigned. Tyler aroused the fury of the whig party, which had nominated and elected him as vice president, by his attitude toward the tariff and United States bank. He hoped that the democrats would give

from even asking, but was disappointed. Like the two Adamses, he did not attend the inauguration of his successor. It is said that he left the White House early on the morning of March 4 and drove to the wharf of the Potomac river steamer to take passage for his Virginia home The boat was leaving. Someone called: Hold on, there! President Tyler is coming." The captain, a Clay whig, shouted back: "Ex-President Tyler be hanged! Let him stay" And the presidential party was left on the wharf.

Fillmore's Fall. Millard Fillmore served three of the

four years to which Zachary Taylor was elected. At the whig convention of 1852 he was a candidate for the presidential nomination, and on the first ballot commanded 133 votes. One hundred and Tortyseven were necessary to a choice. On the fifty-third ballot Winfield Scott was nominated. In 1856 Fillmore won the coveted comination, but the whig party was by that time in its death throes. Fillmore had only eight votes in the electoral college. The democratic candidate. James Buchanan, won the election, though the newly organized republican party, with "The Pathfinder," John C. Fremont, as its andidate, already showed a lusty growth. Only once has it been necessary for the senate to exercise its right to elect the ice president, a right conferred by the wifth amendment if no candidate for the vice presidential office receives a majority of the electoral votes. This happened n 1837, when Richard M. Johnson, nomnated on the same ticket with Martin

viding that the president of the senate and after him the speaker of the house should succeed to the presidency in case that the president and vice president should not be able to perform the duties of the office. When Vice President Hendricks died in 1882 it was seen that the death of the president would place the government in the hands of the republi cans, though the people had voted that the democrats should be in power for four years. In January, 1886, congress passed a new presidential succession act by which, after the president and vice presi dent, the members of the cabinet suc ceed to the presidency—the secretary of state, the secretary of the treasury, the secretary of war, the secretary of the navy, the postmaster general, the secretary of the interior and the attorney general, in the order of the creation of the departments down to the time of the act, which does not include the later Departments of Agriculture and of Commerce and Labor .- The Voter, Chicago.
