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TERMS FOR TELEGRAPHERS

Conditions Which Board of Mediation Secured for Operators on Rock Island.

"No. 2. aOld. bNew. WASHINGTON, Aug. 16-The terms of the agreement between the Rock Island railroad and the officials of the Order of Railway Telegraphers, representing the 624.00 railroad company's force of operators, in regard to the controversy over an interpretation of the nine-hour act, was made public today. The agreement provides that day and night forces, where two telegraph ers are employed, nine hours of total service in a twelve-hour spread, commencing between the hours of 6:30 and 7:30 a. m or p. m.; shall constitute a day's work, and that in no case shall the nine hours be \$3.5254ga.80. separated into more than two periods. Where three operators are employed nine hours of total service in an eleven-hour

CLOUDBURST NEAR JACKSON ST. LOUIS Aug. 15-WHEAT-Lower.

Bridges Washed Away and Much Dumage is Done to Crops.

LINCOLN. Neb., Aug. 16 -Burlington railroad reports from Jackson, in Dakota county, say there was a cloudburst in that town and vicinity tonight. Many bridges were washed out and much damage done to crops. The rainfall was heavy all over the district. There was no loss of life so far as know .

General rains throughout lowa and other portions of the corn belt were the main reason for a severe slump in corn prices. The September option was sold freely on the probability that receipts will be much more liberal in the near future, while the December was sold on the theory that lis premium over May was too great. The Hinois crop report for August showed a loss in acreage of 514.005 acres and a gain of two points in condition, compared with the government figures. The market was weak throughout the entire day, and closed only a trifle above the low mark. The September opened 'we's to 'se lower at 76% 076% c, sold at 76% 077e and then de-clined to 75% c. The close was at 75% c. Local receipts were 100 oars, with 51 of contract grade.
