THOUSANDS GREET SAILORS

Admirals and Officers Given First Official Dinner.

FORMAL LANDING ON FRIDAY

American Battleships Welcomed to Australia by Great Crowds--Every Courtesy Shown to Visitors.

SYDNEY, N. S. W., Aug. 20--The first day of the sojourn of the American battleships at Sydney has passed and while there have been comparatively few functions--tomorrow being set aside for the public reception and the official landing--the spirit of cordiality and whole-hearted welcome which fills the people of this city has found opportunity for expression in several ways.

This afternoon the admirals of the fleet and the captains of the various battleships came ashore and called officially upon Lord Northcote, governor general of Australia, and Sir Harry Rawson, governor of New South Wales. The American officers were saluted upon landing. Later the governor returned this official call and was in his turn saluted by the admirals.

This evening Lord Northcote gave a dinner in honor of the American officers. There were present sixty-six Americans, including the admirals and the captains, as well as Sir Harry Rawson, the British admiral, ministers of the state and of the commonwealth and a number of judges and local naval and military officers of high rank.
