Deny They Have Lost Big.

As to the loss of grain shipments, the Rock Island officials deny they have lost heavily, if at all. They point to the record of the last six months, following two letters sent out by the Grain exchange and Commercial club, advising against shipping over the Rock Island lines, as months when they received their share of the grain business.

A glance at the records in any railroad office or in the office of the grain exchange shows that the metchandise shippers struck the hardest blow.

The Rock Island has been bringing some grain to Omaha, but it has been taking out what the officials call "our full sliare."

Buring March, when shipments were the "heaviest, the following is the record which shows the cars secured out of Omaha by the Rock Island as compared to the Great Western and Illinois, Central lines, roads which hid for the shipments out of Omaha without originating the grain:

During seven days in May and June the Rock Island accured sixty-nine cars and during the same seven days the Great Western secured seventy-three and the Illinois Central seventy-two cars. But the Rock Island had to scheme to

get all of the business which it has seoured in grain shipments. At times there were buyers on the Omaha market who bought largely to secure the traffic for the Rock Island lines. Sometimes these buyers secured two trainloads before they were discovered, and then some grain dealers would refuse to sell to them, and the first thing the exchange knew some other buyer bobbed, up, looking innocent, but securing a trainload of grain and routing ti by the Rock Island. This cost the road a little trouble, but, it is said, got the business and many times got more than any other line, while not bringing a large amount to the market.

Secretary E. J. McVann of the grain exchange is out of the city, as is also J. M. Guild, commissioner of the grain exchange. The letters are said to be authorized by the transportation committees of the two organizations, which accepted the promise of the Rock Island lines that the right thing would be done by Omaha when the tariffs were revised.

Grain Men Get Case Set Off.

Grain men doing business in Omaha and other Missouri river points have secured a continuance of the case and the date set for the ceshation of the payment of elevation allowances at the Missouri river points until December 1, which will sermit most of the grain from this section being shipped under the old rules.

On complaint of the St. Louis Merchants' association the Interstate Commerce commission ordered the railroads to cease paying elevation allowances at Missouri river olnts October I. No order was made against other points and naturally when it was brought to the attention of the conmission that body soon recognized that this was a discrimination against Omaha and other Missouri river points. As a consequence the Interstate Commerce commission has postponed the effectiveness of this order until December 1 to give the grain men at the Missouri points time t present their cases.


FRONTIER DAY THE BEST EVER Buchking Bronchos Real Thing, Says Charley Lane, Who Took Party Out.
