Alabania and Louisiana. The plan for "the invasion of the south" was outlined by Mr. Taft, the republican candidate for president, in recent speeches and interviews in Hot Springs, Vs. He expressed the opinion that the republican national campaign managers ought to try to carry close districts, and Mr. Hitchcock concurs in that wiew.

Alvah H. Martin, member of the national committee from Virginia and Representative C. B. Slemp, the state chairman, conferred with Mr. Hitchoock and urged that an effort should be made to carry three districts at least in Virginia. These are the Ninth, which Mr. Slemp now represents in congress; the Fifth, which was democratic by only about 100 votes at the last congreasional election, and the Richmond district. Major P. D. Barker, the national mitteeman from Alabama, declared that there is a good chance to carry some of the morthern or mountain districts of his state, and P. B. Williams, state chairman for Louisiana, urged that a fight be made in certain Louisiana districts.

SEAGIRT, N. J., Aug. 21.-In a startling public proclamation issued today from the anumer capital, Governor Fort declares that unless the excise law is observed in Atlantic City, which he calls a "Saturnalia of vice." next Sunday, and all saloons and cafes closed tightly, he will call an extraordinary session of the legislature and may send the New Jersey state troops to the famous resort, declaring the city to beunder martial law.

This is the most drastic action ever taken to enforce a general law in New Jersey. Governor Fort, in his proclamation, ridicules the flason of ten days ago, when a grand jury at May's Landing, the county seat, refused to find indictments and says that the action was a burleague; that three members of the grand jury were owners of saloons in Atlantic City and that the others were in sympathy with the violators of the inw. Bryan Has Some Strong Points on Which He Builds Hopes.

SAN FRANCISCO. Aug. E .- (Special) Telegram.)-Unless something unforseen happens to change materially the political situation, the great states of the middle and far west unquestionably will cast their electoral votes for William Howard Taft.
