WELCH'S BLUDGEON WINNER

Drives in the Runs Omaha Needs in Both of the Games.

FRANK'S FIELDING A FEATURE

Has Seventeen Chances in the Two Games Which He Accepts With an Error—Second Game a Pitcher's Battle.

DES MOINES, Sept. 1.—The Champions secured ample revenge for the double defeat administered to them by the Boosters last Sunday by taking both games from Des Moines by the score of 5 to 2 and 4 to 2. The bat of Harry Welch was responsible for both victories by Omaha. Once in each game he put the ball over the right field fence, with men on second and third. He batted in three runs in the first game and two in the second. All four pitchers did good work, Ragan being in the best form of the four, with Herzog slightly better. Welch, with perfect support, would have given the Champions an awful battle. Only one of the runs in the latter game was earned by the winners, in the fourth inning Herzog struck out Fisher, but the ball escaped Herzog and Welch, allowing "Red" first. The next up hit short and an easy double should have resulted, but Chouinard, who was playing there, Kelly had been injured in the first game, muffed it. Austin sacrificed and then Welch doubled. Herzog struck out nine and allowed but three clean hits. Captain Frank Omaha played a wonderful fielding game. He accepted seventeen chances without an error. In addition he batted well.
