NEW YORK DEFEATS CHICAGO Giants Win Crucial Game of Series Two to One. CUBS WILL FILE PROTEST

NEW YORK, Sept. 23.—According to the official score of the New York base ball club, the local Nationals won today's game from the champions at the Polo ground by a score of 2 to 1. The game has been protested by the Chicago club, but President Pulliam denied tonight that he had taken any action in the matter, as he cannot do until after the game has been presented to him in the regular form. His official announcement tonight was a denial of a rumor that he had declared the game a tie. Following is the statement: "The New York stock ticker tonight having carried this statement: 'Harry Pulliam, president of the National league, decides today's game between Chicago and New York a tie, and announces that it must be played over,' I say this statement is unauthorized. I have made no decision and I will not until the matter is presented to me in regular form."

In the ninth inning, with two men out, McCormick of New York was on base and scored the winning run on a single by Merkle. The Chicago players contended that Merkle was out at first before McCormick reached the home plate, but Umpire O'Day ruled that Merkle was safe at first and that New York won twenty thousand spectators surged onto the field while the argument was in progress and there was much confusion and delay over O'Day's final decision.
