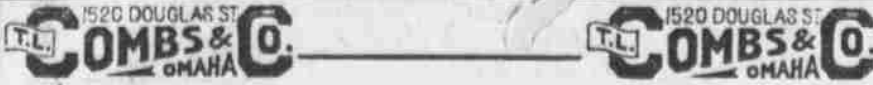

Dundee Presbyterians Are Excavating for New Building.

MORE FUNDS ARE YET NEEDED

Money is Being Donated by People of Various Denominations Who Reside in the Beautiful Suburb.

The Dundee Presbyterian people have been excavating this week for their new building. The plans and specifications are ready to place in the hands of bidders. While the plan is to utilize the framework of the old building, the result will be practically a new building. It is to be of brick veneer with basement, Sunday school, the only thing that now delays the work is the securing of another \$1,000 which is hoped by the trustees will be obtained the coming week. This much is needed for meeting the conditions under which the beginning must be made. The generous support thus far given by the trustees and those that the money will be given in a few days. Those who have seen the plans are pleased with the beauty and convenience of the proposed structure. The architect is especially happy in the plans for seating the main auditorium and in conveniences in the basement for Sunday school and social purposes. 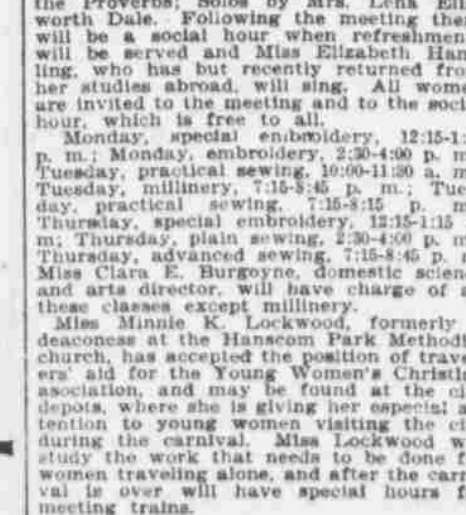
