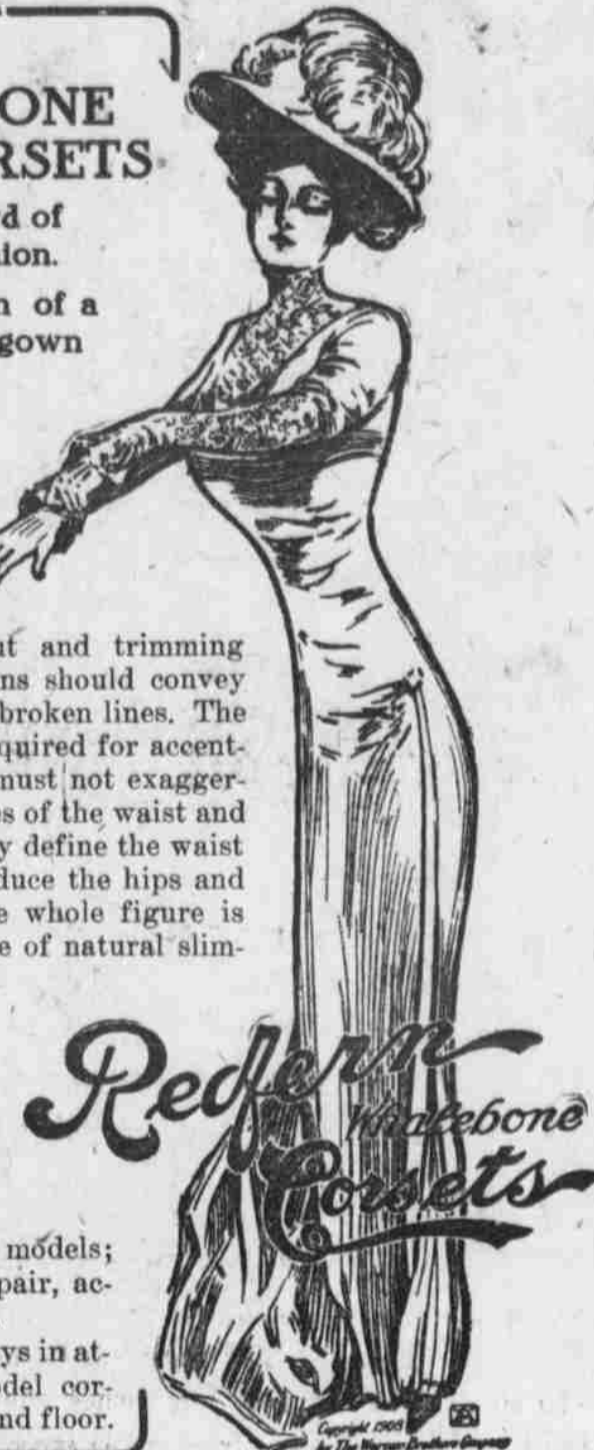

Latta and his check book as the populist nominee to take the place made vacant by the declination of Edgar Howard. Some of the populists told the democrats they are going to log off and should remove a democrat or two from the state ticket. But Mr. Tom Allen would not stand for that.

John J. Ryder, state president of the Fraternal Order of Eagles, speaking of the next national convention of the order, to be held in Omaha, says: "I note in various Eagle publications a proposition is being agitated to hold the grand eagle meeting at the same time as the Ak-Sar-Ben festival. In my judgment, that would be a grave mistake, and I do not believe the result would be at all satisfactory." The Eagles simply would not be likely to draw 50,000 people to Omaha, because of its very central location geographically and because of the many trunk lines of railroad running into Omaha.

"The Ak-Sar-Ben festivities always draw an immense throng, and next year will be no exception. Omaha simply would not be able to take care of the multitudes if the two events were to be combined. We want all Eagles well come, and their friends, to have the enjoyment of comforts of living as well as fraternal pleasures. Hence, we must not encourage any move that would crowd everything to its utmost possible limit, and beyond. So I am in favor of the grand eagle meeting being held about the first week in September, when our weather conditions are as a rule, ideal for real enjoyment, and I hope the Omaha committee having the arrangement of Ak-Sar-Ben will work to have the grand eagle meeting at that time."
