NEW YORK, Nov. 5.—The stock market today gave plain signs of feeling the effect of the speculative pace which was set for it today and became quiet and hesitating in the course of the day's business.

Stocks were fed out freely to meet the demand from the outset. All bids were filled from the market and the market was a disposition to push the sales at discounts by the election returns.

Emergency Hospital Needs Council Ignores Appeal of Dr. Connell for Food, Fuel and Beds. Five days have elapsed since Dr. R. W. Connell, city commissioner of health, on October 31 notified the city council that provisions at the emergency hospital were exhausted and that there was only enough coal to last two days, but nothing has been done.

The communications from the health commissioner were taken up Tuesday evening and referred to the committee of the whole, which meets next Monday afternoon.

Dr. Strouse, the physician in charge at the hospital, is without food, fuel or blankets, and is in the opinion of Dr. Connell, as in danger of other serious complications.

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
