BOMB DESTROYS TAXICAB
Woman Leaves Infernal Machine in Public Vehicle in New York.

RATE FOR OIL COMPANY ONLY
Railway Officials Testify in Case Against Standard Company—Runaway Adds Spice to Horse Show.

NEW YORK, Nov. 14.—The explosion of a bomb in a taxicab in front of the Grand Central station on Forty-second street created excitement in the vicinity about midnight. The cab was wrecked but so far as is known no one is hurt.
According to the police the machine was hired by a woman in front of a Broadway restaurant and she is supposed to have placed the bomb. Diamond Phanaus was the chauffeur in charge of the taxicab. He said he was waiting in front of a Broadway restaurant when a young woman dressed in black appeared and said she was in a hurry to go to the Grand Central depot. Upon arriving at the depot the woman stepped from the taxicab and handed the chauffeur 75 cents without asking the amount she owed. "We are not allowed to take this. Your fare is only 50 cents," protested Phanaus, but the woman ignored him and hurried into the depot.
Phanaus said he looked into the cab and saw what appeared to be a box on the floor. He hurried after the woman and just as he entered the door of the station he heard an explosion, close followed by another, but slighter shock. Forgetting the woman, Phanaus turned to the door again. He found his taxicab had been blown to fragments. The woman had evidently some knowledge of the makeup of the taxicabs, for she had placed the bomb as the chauffeur said, in just the spot where it would do the most damage. It had ripped up the seats, shattered the floor, wrecked the machine and caused the gasoline tank to explode.
When the police searched for the young woman they found she had slipped quietly out of the depot and disappeared.
Rate for Standard Only.
Only two witnesses testified at today's session of the hearing of the government's suit to dissolve the Standard Oil company of New Jersey. They were Horatio Tucker, former general freight agent of the New York Central railroad and more recently chairman of the Chicago and St. Louis Tariff association, and Fred O. Hollands, tariff clerk for the Chicago & Alton railroad. The testimony of these two witnesses was confined almost entirely to interstate and interstate freight rates and the distinctions made by the railroad companies in submitting tariff sheets to the Interstate Commerce commission. It was apparent that the government's attorney was endeavoring to secure information which is to be used later in the case in an effort to show that the Standard Oil company was favored with reduced rates. Hollands proved the more important of the two witnesses. He told of a 6-cent-a-hundred rate between "Indian, Ind." and Chicago which was granted to the Standard Oil company only.
Runaway in Horse Show.
With the closing of the horse show only one night off the attendance at Madison Square garden tonight was perhaps the largest since the opening.

BRYAN MAN FOR SPEAKER
George W. Leidigh of Nebraska City is the Candidate.

PREVIOUS EXPERIENCE SLOGAN
Will Take the Field Against Charley Pool of Johnson County, Supposed Corporation Favorite for the Place.

George W. Leidigh of Nebraska City is the Bryan candidate for speaker of the house in the coming legislature as opposed to Charley Pool of Johnson county, the corporation candidate.
Mr. Leidigh and Henry Gerdes of Falls City are the only two democrats elected to the legislature who have ever had previous legislative experience, and this fact will be urged in his behalf. He was a member of the session of 1893 when the fusionists had a majority in the house of two and he helped greatly in the organization of that house for the fusionists. He also took a lead in the election of W. V. Allen to the United States senate. His share in the work of that session made him a prominent man in the democratic and populist ranks of Nebraska.
Mr. Leidigh also served as warden of the penitentiary, being appointed under the Holcomb regime. He gained the closest friendship of the Holcomb and Allen populists and the Bryan democrats. "He has always been a close friend of Mr. Bryan. It was he, in fact, who nominated William J. Bryan for congress in 1896."
Anti-Morton Man.
Always an anti-Morton (J. Sterling Morton) man, Mr. Leidigh has been on one side of the two democratic factions in his own city, but at present he is said to have all Otto county back of him in his race for the speakership. His people will urge that because of his previous service to the party, his knowledge of legislative affairs and his ardent friendship for the man who has thrice led his party to national defeat, Mr. Leidigh ought to be elected speaker this winter at Lincoln. He is about 36 years of age and has a family in Nebraska City. It is believed that when the lines are strung out Leidigh will be able to give his friend from Johnson county a rather interesting run for the big chair.
It is said that Mr. Bryan is extremely anxious to secure the election of Leidigh. Bryan's one purpose is to dictate to this legislature, a thing most people regard as an impossibility. He believes that he can

TOBACCO DUTY SATISFACTORY
Neither Republicans Nor Democrats Desire to Change Present Tariff Schedules.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14.—From the attitude assumed by both republican and democratic members of the house ways and means committee at today's hearing on the proposed revision of the tariff it became evident that there is general satisfaction with the present duties on tobacco and tobacco manufactures. The democrats appear content with the present high tariff on the ground that tobacco is a production from which the government should derive revenue, while the republicans favor the present rates because they offer the protection desired by the American tobacco interests. Representatives of the tobacco growers of New England, Florida and Georgia opposed any change for higher or lower rates, contending that such action would disturb the conditions of the trade.
While M. L. Floyd, chairman of the tobacco Board of Trade of the Connecticut valley was giving the committee information.
