KIRKLAND TIRES OF JAIL.

Willing to Go to Penitentiary to Get Out of It.

JUDGE ACCOMMODATES HIM

Afterward Takes Up Condition of the Jail With the County Board, but Little Encouragement for a New Structure.

In order, as he stated to the court, to avoid remaining any longer in the county jail, the condition of which was declared by the grand jury to be dangerous to the health of the inmates, John Kirkland, indicted on a charge of bigamy, pleaded guilty before Judge Green, who committed him to the penitentiary at Fort Madison for an indeterminate sentence, the maximum of his imprisonment being fixed at three years.
