### Current Literature

The Circle magazine for December comes with a gay Christmas cover, which is an index of the contents of the number. There is an editorial entitled "There Was No Room for Them at the Inn," and five real Christmas articles—"Holly and Bells," by Leo Crane; "The White Turkey," by Lillian Bell; "The Value of Christmas," by Hamilton Wright Mabie; "That Christmas," by Reginald Wright Knickerbocker; and "Christmas in Our Town." There is also a Christmas song entitled "A Noel: The Song of the Seraph," and several other interesting stories and articles in addition to the regular departments of this magazine.

The December number of The House-keeper contains an article by John N. Greer on "The Real Issue of The High School Fraternity," which is of interest to parents of students. The subject is handled without gloves. Another striking feature is a personal account by Queen Carmen Sylvia of Roumania, telling how she obtained the famous Iron crown. "Una de las Garden," is the new serial, by J. M. Montgomery. There is also a very good story by Grace MacGowan Cooke, and Christmas hints and suggestions.
