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NEW YORK STOCKS AND BONDS

Market is Cheerful, but Volume of Business is Small. CHANGE IN BASIS OF BOND SALES. New Rule Adds Interest to Quotations Causing Confusion—New York Central Makes Sharp Advance.

NEW YORK, Jan. 2.—The first business day of the year was cheerfully in the stock market, although the volume was small, owing to the number of investors absent to prolong the holiday until Sunday.

The banking community was busy at the start, but the market was a good deal of confusion over the first working of the new rule for the quotation of bonds to be "and interest." The obligation on bond buyers to allow accrued interest to the seller under the full period has necessitated a complicated re-adjustment of prices which dislocated the comparison with ruling prices.

New York Central was conspicuous for its sharp rise, an unexpected short interest figuring apparently in its violent advance. The slight advance for November, a similar decrease in gross earnings being accompanied by a sharp decline in operating expenses, with corresponding advance to the net showing. The New York Central exhibit was the more remarkable by contrast with the Pennsylvania report which disclosed a decline of \$1,035,000 in the net earnings for the year.

The market in general was sluggish. The sharp increase of 4 1/2 in the price of surplus available freight cars reported by the American Railway association gave intimation of the shrinkage in the bank movement for the later weeks.
