FAREWELL SPEECH PROPHECIC
Just Forty-Eight Years Ago Lincoln Told Springfield Goody, Questioning His Fate.
Just forty-eight years ago Thursday—February 11, 1881—Abraham Lincoln bade goodbye to his friends and neighbors in Springfield, Ill., and took the train for Washington to become president of the United States. It was the day before his 52d birthday anniversary. The little speech he made to his assembled neighbors on that occasion thoroughly betrays his feeling of uncertainty, if not apprehension as to his fate, though his feeling cannot be construed into one of fear, for his indifference to his safety at all times was a constant source of annoyance to his friends and associates in the administration.
