SHUMWAY DIES FOR CRIME

FACED DEATH FOR FIFTH TIME

Appenia, Rehearings and Allegations of Error Have Enabled Him to Escape-Story of His Brutal Crime.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Murch 5 .- Special Telegram. After successfully evading the gallows five times, R. Mend Shumway at 2:22 this afternoon paid the penalty for the brunal He went to the scaffold without faltering

and died protesting his innocence

Judge Hamer, his attorney, had worked all morning in an effort to secure another may of execution, but every attempt failed. The hanging was without sensalonal incident except that five minutes after the drop fell it was necessary for hose in charge of the hanging to readjust the rope around Shumway's neck, though he was all but dead at the time.

At 2:00 the death warrant was read to Shumway by Chief Clerk Heilman. "Well, I'm here all right," was Shumway's only response. At 1:30 the death march started from the hospital wing to ie warehouse in the broom factory, where

to gallows had been erected. Shumway walked upon the scaffold without hesitation. Just before the black cap was pulled down over his face he said: "May God forgive those who have anyhing to do to me. You are hanging an

His appeal to the supreme court was based upon alleged irregularity in impauneling a Jury and was overruled as was the motion for rehearing. On the latter the court was evenly divided. The opinion was written by Justice Lenton and concurred in by Judges Barnes and Root. Chief Justice Reese and Judges Fawcett and Dean dissented while Rose by reason of his former connection with the attorney general's office, was disqualified from sitting in the
