SMYTH RECEIVES SCORING

English Defends Clients and Raps Opposing Attorney.

CONNOR WILL CASE GETS HECTIC

Privilege of Judicial Trial Only Thing Which Prevents Libel and Damage Suits, Declares the County Attorney.

A defense of Mrs. Mary Lamb and her father, in kind upon Attorney C. J. Smyth, who had attacked Mrs. Lamb and other relatives of Joseph A. Connor, made noteworthy the argument of County Attorney James P. English in the will case yesterday afternoon. Mr. Smyth, who had gone rough-shod for several of the witnesses and relatives fighting the probating of the will came in for a smashing attack from the first opposing attorney to speak. During the closing portion of his address

English declared that "Mr. Smyth thought it might be unpopular to hear down heavily on the women who live in Omaha and with his most unctuous manner and Chesterfieldian air he excludes from his charge of perjury and conspiracy Mrs. O'Connor and Miss Grace Connor. He prefers to attack the women living abroad, but he knows full well that his general charge includes all the relatives.

"It is asking too much, Mr. Smyth, of the credulity of anybody. There is no exigency in this case to violate the plainest experience of human kind. There is no one who has heard the evidence in this case or who sees the witnesses who will believe they have done anything criminal."

Sullivan and Smith Talk Today.
English did not devote much of his time to the law in the case, leaving that to Judge Sullivan, who will speak this morning, and will be followed by E. P. Smith, who will close for the proponents. English did, however, set forth that "there is only one proposition of law in this case. When a man executes a will and it passes into his control and he dies and no will is found, there is a presumption of law that he destroyed the will with the intention of revoking it. The burden is on the other side to show that he did not so act. We may introduce evidence to fortify the presumption."

A new Young Women's Christian association building has recently been opened in Calcutta, India, and a boarding home reopened and enlarged. This building has been purchased and includes twenty-six rooms, with offices, gymnasium, library, reading room, drawing room, meeting hall, lecture room, dining room and nine bed rooms. This work has grown from five rooms, which have housed the home during the last eight years.

Bayley, the Rev. Charles A. Campbell of Denver, and the Rev. Charles R. Brown of Oakland, Cal., will speak at the western student conference. Dr. J. G. K. McClure of Chicago will give two addresses at the central student conference.
