BAD MAN CAUGHT, POLICE SAY

Gives Name of Joe Carr and is Accused of Robbery.

IDENTIFIED BY POOL HALL MAN

Charged with Taking Nearly One Hundred Dollars from the Till of A. J. Carey's Place on Sixteenth Street.

The capture of a safe burglar and all around crook of wide experience is believed by the police to have been accomplished early Sunday morning in the arrest of a man who gives his name as Joe Carr, his late residence as Nebraska City and his nativity as Italian.

Carr was picked under arrest about 3:45 o'clock Sunday morning by Patrolmen Haged and Bitters in the Third ward. He was noticed on the street by the officers and, in their opinions, was acting rather strangely.

Carr was searched at the police station after having been booked as a suspicious character. Carr was found to have \$85.00 on his person, also a watch. The large amount of money, about \$40 of which was silver, aroused the suspicion of Desk Sergeant Marshall, who directed that he be held for careful investigation by the detectives.

A. J. Carey, proprietor of a pool hall at 36 North Sixteenth street, cleared up the mystery and suspicious about Carr by reporting the robbery of his safe later Sunday morning. He said that \$85.00 and his gold watch had been stolen and described both, saying that \$60 of the money was in silver.
