INDIAN BLAMES UNCLE SAM

Hiram Chase of Pender Defends Crazy Snake's Conduct.

SAYS U. S. DISREGARDS TREATIES

Questions Right of Congress to Incorporate Indian Tribe and Its Territory as Integral Part of State.

Hiram Chase of Pender, county attorney of Thurston county, a full-blooded Indian of the Omaha tribe, attributes the Indian troubles in Oklahoma to the United States' disregard of the treaties it has made with Indian tribes. He says "the primal cause of discontent among the Indians is responsible for Chief Crazy Snake's rebellion. He is personally acquainted with this old chief and is thoroughly informed on Indian history and conditions. Mr. Chase was elected county attorney over a white man. He is typically Indian in appearance, but is well educated and is regarded as a strong, brainy man. He represents most of his people in legal and commercial affairs. While in Omaha on

legal business he gave The Bee this interview on the Oklahoma situation:

"What is the cause of the miseries of Chief Crazy Snake and his tribe of Creek Indians of Oklahoma?"

"Although different reasons may be given for the troubles of Chief Crazy Snake and his followers of the Creek tribe of Indians of Oklahoma, upon investigation it will be found that the basic cause of the miseries of this people (as in most cases of Indian troubles) arises from a disregard of the treaties made by the United States with the Indian tribes.

What History Shows.

"History and public documents will show that the Creek tribe or nation of Indians as a separate and distinct political community, had from time immemorial exercised the right of self-government (which inheres in every political body) upon its own territory in what is known as the state of Alabama.

"Under what circumstances and vicissitudes which follow in the course of human affairs this people was induced to give up their country in Alabama need not be inquired into. Suffice it to say that during the '30s by a series of negotiations and treaties of the United States made with this tribe, a tract of country in the Indian territory (now the state of Oklahoma) was confirmed unto them forever with a guar-

antee that they should enjoy and exercise their ancient rights of self-government in their new country unmolested and under the protection of the United States government.

"During the winter of 1906, while on tribal business for the Omaha Indians of Nebraska at Washington, D. C., I became acquainted with Chief Crazy Snake and other notables of the Creek tribe, who were then at the seat of government of the United States, complaining of many grievances, among which was the proposed measure of congress of organizing the Creek Indian country secured to the tribe by treaty as aforementioned, as a part of the proposed state of Oklahoma.

Without Their Consent.

"Whether or not the Creek Indian country has been included as a part of Oklahoma, I have not learned, but presume that it was done without their consent, as the recent 'Indian policy' in such matters rests upon the erroneous doctrine that congress has power even to annihilate treaty rights of Indian tribes without their consent, and these laws of congress go to the full extent of depriving these Indian communities of their ancient right of governing themselves and their own peculiar concerns within their own territories, but under the protection of the federal government, and separate and apart from the state governments, as was the original plan instituted by the framers of the United States government.

"It must be observed that these Creek Indians are classed with the Cherokee, Chickasaw, Seminole and Delaware tribes as the most civilized Indian tribes of the United States; that they had attained such a degree of civilization as to organize their tribal governments on the same plan as those of the state governments, having separate departments for the exercise of the three branches of government to-wit: Legislative, judicial and executive.

Hard to Justify.

"In view of these facts it is hard to conceive of any doctrine in international law or constitutional principle which will justify congress in assuming the power to incorporate an Indian tribe and its territory as an integral part of a state government without the consent of the Indian tribe concerned in the matter.

"It seems to me that if congress can do

this it can on the same principle incorporate the states of Iowa and Nebraska into one state without the concurrence of the people of both states, and it requires but little argument to show that the enforcement of such a measure would lead to anarchy.

"In the case of the Creek tribe of Indians, while it may be true that renegades and fugitives from justice from the states find refuge in the Creek community and have precipitated the recent troubles among this people, this is but an incident in the progress of human affairs which is likely to occur even among the most civilized people.

What Drives Them On?

"Is not that which drives Chief Crazy Snake and his followers with their innocent women and children from their burning homes to find safety among mountains, the armed militia of the state of Oklahoma in its endeavor to enforce its laws over an Indian tribe—a separate and distinct political body occupying its own territory by virtue of solemn treaties of the government?"

And what force has a law of congress which incorporates an Indian tribe and its territory as an integral part of a state without consulting the wishes of the Indian tribe concerned in such a matter?

"These are the vital questions involved in the case of Chief Crazy Snake and his tribe of Creek Indians of Oklahoma."

MARK TWIN OPENS ROAD

Humorist Attends Formalities at Norfolk with Railroad Financiers.

NORFOLK, Va., April 2.—The opening of the Virginia railway, extending from Sewell's Point, Norfolk, to Deepwater, W. Va., on the Kanawha river, a distance of 445 miles, took place today with an elaborate celebration here, made notable by the presence of H. H. Rogers, who personally built the Virginia at a cost of about \$40,000,000; Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain) and several New York financiers interested with Mr. Rogers in the undertaking.

HANGED FOR MURDER OF DEPUTY DURING JAIL BREAK

William Hayes Pays Penalty at Deer Lodge, Mont.—Second Execution at Kallispell.

HELENA, Mont., April 2.—William Hayes, who was hanged at Deer Lodge today, was convicted of complicity in the murder of Deputy Warden John A. Robinson at the state penitentiary in March, 1908, when he with three other convicts made a desperate but unsuccessful effort to escape. One of his companions had been hanged, a second is serving a life term in the penitentiary, while the third was acquitted.

F. Marion Crawford Improves

SORRENTO, April 2.—The improvement of the condition of F. Marion Crawford, the novelist, continues today. It is said Mr. Crawford's greatest regret at being ill arises from the fact that he has been obliged to suspend his historic work on medieval Italy, a labor to which he has devoted himself for several years.
