Foreign cables came easier and were lower at the opening on wheat, but did not affect the opening. The domestic markets were firmer and better supported after yesterday's decline.

Wheat held steady and some heavy receipts were light. Millers are taking all offerings quickly. May wheat opened at 1.25 and closed at 1.24.

Primary wheat receipts were 280,000 bushels and shipments were 230,000 bushels.

Clearance were 400,000 bushels of corn, none of oats and wheat and flour equal to 22,000 bushels.

Liverpool closed 1/32 lower on wheat and 1/16 higher on corn.
