IS FIRE WARDEN ACT VOID?

Question is Raised as to Validity of Law Recently Passed.

BILL NOT PROPERLY DRAWN

It is Said to Violate Provision of Constitution Relating to Form of Appropriations for Salaries.

LINCOLN, Neb., April 25.—(Special.)—One reason why the governor has not announced the appointment of a state fire-warden is the fact that the validity of the act under which the appointment is made is questioned.

The salaries are to be paid by a tax upon insurance companies to be paid on or before January of each year. No state funds are appropriated by the act, nor are any funds appropriated by any other bill for this purpose.

LINCOLN, Neb., April 25.—(Special.)—One reason why the governor has not announced the appointment of a state fire-warden is the fact that the validity of the act under which the appointment is made is questioned. The salaries are to be paid by a tax upon insurance companies to be paid on or before January of each year. No state funds are appropriated by the act, nor are any funds appropriated by any other bill for this purpose. The bill was introduced by Representative Brown of Lancaster. Its validity is questioned, because it contains two provisions in contravention of the constitution, which says: "Bills making appropriations for the pay of members and officers of the legislature, and for the salaries of the officers of the government, shall contain no provision on any other subject." If the bill is valid the officers working under it can hardly receive any pay before the first of next year. The act is to go into effect July 1. Lancaster Bar Meets. In a letter from Francis A. Brogan to Dean Cottigan of the Nebraska college of law, read at the Lancaster County Bar association banquet, the former said that doubtless the State Bar association would have a part in the selection of the next judges of the supreme court.
