The resolutions set out that cars are switched to South Omairs, Council Bluffs. Albright, Avery and other suburby about Omalia at a rate of \$5 per carload, also that the Omaha road now switches los and oal between Florence and Omaha for E Der Car.

The Improvement and Commercial clubs efer to the fact that prior to January 1. 1907, the city of Florence had a "commodity rate" which enabled dealers to ship umber, lime, coal, coment and other materials from Omaha to Florence for 15 to so per car, but since that time the dealers have been paying 2 /cents per hundred pounds, making a car shipment cest from \$9 to \$14 more than the former rate or than the switching rates to points where the service performed is no greater.

As a result of the failure of the Omaha oad to make a \$5 or \$6 switching rate to Florence the business men of that suburb claim the materiala for building there are all hauled to Florence by wagon and that the wagon hauf has been substituted aimost entirely for rail bailing.

The resolutions passed by the Commercial club were also adopted by the Flor ence Improvement club at a meeting of the organization held Tuesday evening. B. C. Fowler was elected president to success F. S. Tucker, who resigned because of his election as mayor.


