

BALLOON LECTURES GIVEN

Words Instead of Deeds Inevitable at Fort Omaha.

WEATHER STOPS ASCENSIONS

Captain Chandler and Lieutenant Lahn Take Visiting Officers in Tow and Install Aeronautilus Lore.

Murky weather is still interfering with the projected balloon experiments at Fort Omaha and thus far the work is confined to indoor lectures, with Captain C. DeF. Chandler and Lieutenant Frank P. Lahn as the lecturers.

The last of the detail of officers to come to Fort Omaha to receive instruction in aeronautilus arrived from Fort Leavenworth and Washington Tuesday morning. The Fort Leavenworth detail is in charge of Major Edgar Russell of the Signal Corps. The detail consists of Captains A. E. Cowan, Signal Corps; A. C. Knowles, Thirtieth Infantry; L. D. Wildman, Signal Corps; R. C. Langdon, Tenth Infantry; C. H. Bridges, Fifteenth Infantry; P. H. Mulvey, Fourteenth Infantry; B. O. Lenoir, Signal Corps; First Lieutenant E. F. Curran, Thirtieth Infantry; K. T. Smith, Sixth Infantry; H. A. Bell, Fifteenth Infantry; W. C. Jones, Thirtieth Infantry; J. A. Brockman, Seventeenth Infantry; Dawson Omstead, Fifth Field Artillery; H. C. Tatro, Seventh Cavalry, and Second Lieutenant M. L. Love.

The Washington detail consists of First Lieutenants Frank P. Lahn and Benjamin D. Fuls of the Signal Corps; R. S. Bamberger, Second Cavalry, and Second Lieutenants J. G. Winter of the Sixth Cavalry and O. A. Dickinson of the Fifth Infantry.

Lectures Twice a Day

The officers will remain at Fort Omaha until Friday. Lectures will be given each morning and evening. The morning lectures will be given in the big balloon house and hydrogen gas plants and the evening lectures in the post gymnasium hall. These latter lectures will be given chiefly by Lieutenant Lahn and will be illustrated with numerous lantern slides, showing the many different phases of ballooning. Such of the public as may be interested in the art of ballooning or the scientific phases of aeronautilus are invited to attend.

The Baldwin dirigible balloon is now almost completely inflated, and the car is being put in readiness for experimental flights when the weather will permit. Lieutenant Lahn brought with him another spherical balloon and two smaller balloons which will be used in the experiments. These smaller balloons are merely gas supply balloons and will be used only in further inflation of the dirigible needed. The larger spherical balloon will be used daily for experimental flights, but will be a captive balloon, and all the officers of the class will be required to make ascents in it for observation purposes and to give them a knowledge of balloon manipulation. The big Baldwin dirigible will be taken to Fort Leavenworth early in June for demonstration work there, and will later go to Toledo, O. The new spherical balloon will be retained at Fort Omaha for experimental flights. Lieutenant Lahn and the others of the Washington detail will return to Washington early next week or in time to be present when the Wright Brothers are at Fort Myer.
