Tariff First.

By postponing the consideration of the income tax amendment the senate has said unequivocally that nothing is to be permitted to interfere with the prompt disposition of the tariff schedules.

The tariff in itself is a complex and troublesome problem which congress is finding plenty of difficulty in disposing of without intermixing it with extraneous matter.

When this task is accomplished and the best possible judgment obtained as to the amount of revenue the new bill will produce will be time enough to consider other sources of income to fill in should insufficient returns be feared.

The income tax invites wide differences of opinion, both as to policy and legality, and if pressed would be certain to lead to prolonged debate.

The question of a supplementary revenue bill should not be permitted to obstruct the revision which was promised and which the country waits.

Roosevelt and Taft. The address of Henry Clews compares Roosevelt and Taft in a striking way.
