PLAG TO FLAG CAR ARRIVES Pathfinder Machine Reaches Mexico City After Hard Trip.

NEW YORK, June 4—King James, first; Restigouche, second; Celt, third, Thus stands the record of the twenty-third, renewal of the historic Brooklyn handicap, Yun today at Gravesend. The three other starters—High Private, Frank Gill and Berkeley—finished as named, but were beaten off. The time, 2.04, establishes a record for the race, being one-fifth of a second better than the figures hung up last year by Celt.

MEXICO CITY, Mex., June 4—Fred Spooner, William Knopper and James M. 
