Moon Shut Off from Light of Sun for Over an Hour Last Night

Denizens of Lung-if there are any-had an hour of darkness last night, for that planet known as the earth butted squarely or roundly-in between the moon and

The moon entered the shadow of the earth at 5:41 p. m. and became totally eclipsed at 6:68 p. m.. It remained entirely in the shadow until \$:00 p. m. and

wholly emerged at 9:14. The total eclipse was visible in Omaha for about 12 minutes only, and was not distinctly visible because the moon had completely emerged from the shadow before the end of the twilight. It was visible in Chicago for about half an hour and in New York for nearly an hour, but west of Omaha was almost invisible.

This is the first of four ectipses which will take place during 1900, and all of them but one, a solar coltpse, will be visible in the United States to a slight degree at least.
