MOTHER DOES TERRIBLE CRIME

She Asphyxiates Herself and Two Children Because Husband Was Arrested.

ST. LOUIS, June 6.—Twelve hours after her husband, John Glaeser, had been taken from home by the police under the charge of embezzlement, Mrs. Martha Glaeser was found dead in bed by the side of the dead bodies of her children, a girl of 8 years and a boy, 5 years old.

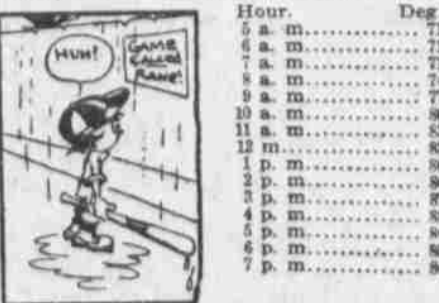
The room was filled with gas and the police advance the theory that the mother, after closing the windows and doors of the room, turned on the gas which ended three lives.

The bodies were found at 9 o'clock this morning. The Glaesers were in the police holdover. His brother, Nicholas Glaeser, broke into the room and discovered the lifeless forms. All were in their night robes. It is supposed that the excitement following the arrest of her husband, preyed on Mrs. Glaeser's mind during Saturday night.

This afternoon, Glaeser was released from the holdover and the clear company, which caused the arrest said there would be no prosecution, as Glaeser had been punished enough already.
