OMAHA DRIVES KARSTEN OUT

It was a gala day at Vinton park and the new stands were filled. Keely was chosen to administer the dose and he did it in the latest fashion. He pitched magnificent ball all the way through and allowed but five hits and passed but one. White his support looks had on the dope sheet, some brilliant catches and stops were made.

Lincoln's four runs were all the result of errors and had one at that. In the third inning Pritchett singled and in trying to catch him leading off too far at first, Kane let the ball get by him and Pritchett circled the sacks. In the eighth Farthing hit a grass-cutter which scooted between King's legs, and Waldron scored him with a triple. Davidson hit a long fly to Pender and Waldron scored. In the ninth inning Schipke threw bad to first on the first man up, and before the ball was found Mason, who had hit for Harris, was on third. He scored on Pritchett's long fly to Fisher.

Omaha started to score in the very first inning when, with two out, Welch was passed. Welch is now the head of the batter of the Western league in the percentage column and all pitchers fear his new willow. He draws more passes than any man in the league. Pender's sacrifice fly to Davidson scored King and Captain Frank hit a double which scored Welch and Schipke.

Karsten started in bad form again in the sixth, when, with one out and after Fisher had singled, Karsten was stabled and Farthing sent in. Farthing is a nice young chap who pitched this spring for the Nebraska Wesleyan university team. He is tall and angular and a southpaw.
