

CADETS ARE NOW IN CAMP

Four Hundred and Fifty High School Boys Go to Ashland.

TENT ON GOVERNMENT RANGE

Lieutenant Haskell of Fort Omaha is in Charge of the Battalion and Prof. Woolery is the Grade Principal.

This is encampment week for the Omaha High school cadets and 450 youthful soldiers left Monday morning for Ashland to spend a week in camp on the government rifle range.

The cadets belong to eight companies of the two battalions and will be under direct command for the week of First Lieutenant W. H. Haskell of Fort Omaha.

The cadets went to Ashland in a special train over the Burlington, leaving at 10:30 thirty minutes behind schedule time.

Thursday will be visitors' day and a special will be run to Ashland over the Burlington to accompany the mothers and sweethearts of the youthful soldiers.

Boys Affirm Men Trained Them to Steal

Youths Arrested for Brass Theft Implicate Two Junk Dealers, One with a Record.

Fines of \$100 and costs each were imposed upon two junk dealers, Rubin Finkelstein and M. Meadow, in police court Monday morning for unlawfully buying railroad brass.

Rolf Hansen, 20 years of age, and Mangus Jensen, 17, were arrested a week ago Sunday for the theft of the brass and when the circumstances in the case were discovered the prosecution was turned against the dealers who bought the stolen property.

The boys testified that the junk dealers told them to steal the metal and sell it to them. They did so every night for a week before being caught by the railway detectives.
