

FUTURE RESTS ON EDUCATION

Solemn Responsibility Confronts Young, Bishop Tells Graduates.

TWENTY-SIX AT BROWNELL HALL

Training of Boys and Girls Who Shall Order Policies of Nation the Prime Requisite, Says Prelate.

Twenty-six young women Tuesday morning received diplomas from Brownell Hall, conferred on them by Right Rev. Arthur L. Williams, Episcopal bishop for Nebraska, on behalf of the board of trustees of the institution, at the graduating exercises held during the forenoon.

The commencement exercises were held in the church of St. Matthias and the address to the graduates was delivered by Bishop Williams in the absence of Right Rev. Anson R. Graves, D. D., L. L. D., Episcopal bishop for Wyoming, who was unable to come on account of a washout along the line. Rev. Addison R. Knickerbocker, rector of St. Matthias church, had charge of the exercises and was assisted by Rev. T. J. Mackay, canon of All Saints church; Canon Marsh of Blair and Rev. J. M. Kohler, rector of the Deaf Mute mission.

The church was crowded with relatives and friends of the graduates, and the exercises were interesting and imposing.

Care for the Future. Bishop Williams, who spoke extemporaneously and without preparation, said in part:

"The future of this nation does not depend upon our great men, our ministers, priests and bishops, or our presidents, statesmen and lawmakers; but it depends on the proper spiritual, moral and intellectual education of the young men and women who shall order the policies of the coming years. The future of our nation, the future of the middle west is being made in our schools, and it is an awful responsibility which is laid upon the church, upon the teachers, upon the parents and upon you, young women of the graduating class."

"If I were to criticize education I would say there is too much stuffing, too much of an attempt to put a quart into a pint measure. Education is not merely reading, writing and arithmetic; education is meant to bring out the latent features in one's character."

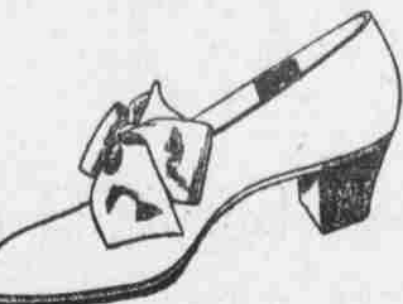
