SHUT OUT WITH LOWER IN BOX

Des Moines is Unable to Hit and Omaha Plays Perfect Game.

THAT MAKES THREE OUT OF FOUR

Pa Soaks Up Big Rain with Sponges and a Wheelbarrow.

FANS LAUGH AT J. FLUVIUS

Lower Holds the Visitors to Five Scrawny Old Hits.

HE IS STRONG IN THE PINCHES

With Men on Bases He Holds Des Moines Safe—Sioux City Comes Today for Series of Four.

Omaha, 4; Des Moines, 0. Three out of four from Des Moines. A clean shut out on a muddy field.

That was the finish of the series with Des Moines, which was hard fought all the way through Omaha last but one game, that of Friday when Frank Lang pitched for the visitors.

Superb pitching by John Lower and perfect fielding back of him by the entire Rourke family was the cause of a shut-out administered by Omaha to the Des Moines team on Saturday before 2,000 fans who insisted on going to Vinton street park in spite of the rain that was pouring down about the time for the fans to leave the central part of the city.

Over 600 stood outside the gate and clamored for admission before Pa Rourke decided to try to play the game. A force of men with shovels and rakes and a wheelbarrow soon ditched the diamond and let the water off. Dry dirt was brought from under the grandstand and a dry path made between home and first, around home and the pitcher's box and around the bases.

Lower was sent to the hill and he showed entirely different form than he displayed in the last Lincoln game. Yesterday he held the Higinnes to five hits, passed but four and made slight assists. The team did not make a bobble back of him and as a consequence Des Moines could not score.

It was not all so easy, however, for Lower was in trouble all the time during the first four innings with men on second and third. After that the way was easy and Des Moines could not score.

How it Came About. In the first inning Art Bader beat out a slow one to Perrine and was sacrificed to second by Colligan, but there he died, for Welch made a circus catch of Mattetek's fly and Captain Dwyer struck out.

In the second inning Lower walked the first two men up as usual, but he threw the air. These hit to Lower and the men on bases moved up a notch. Biersdorfer ended that session by hitting an easy one to Lower.

In the third the first man flew to Captain Franek and Colligan walked. Mattetek hit a home run on bases with one out. They moved along on bases with Dwyer's grounder to Lower and Captain Franek saved the day by nailing Dalton's grounder and subduing him at first.

The fourth was another hard one and then the agony was over. Lower passed the first man up as usual, but he threw the air. These hit to Lower and the men on bases moved up a notch. Biersdorfer ended that session by hitting an easy one to Lower.

In the meantime Omaha had been accumulating enough runs to win the game. A strong effort was made to score in the first on a base on balls, a sacrifice and Welch's single, but Perrine could not deliver. A start was made, however, in the second when, with one out, Franek beat out a bunt. Goding hit to Colligan and that accommodating shortstop fumbled and both were safe. Lower helped them along a base with a sacrifice. The going was soft and the runners did not seem to be able to go on any sort of a hit. Then came "Red" Fisher and with a single drove in the first run.

Two more were marked up in the fourth when, with one down, Goding started the rally with a single. Lower walked and Fisher struck out, but Goding stole third on the play. King walked and Schlipke drove Goding and Lower home with a well-placed single.

Woodbury, the Central High athlete of Kansas City, ran the low hurdles in 0:25, topping one-fifth of a second from the old record.

Byrd of Milford, Ill., was the individual star of the meet, as he scored 13 1/2 points by his own individual efforts. He won the shot-put and the discus throw, and for first with two others in the high jump. Woodbury, Central High, Kansas City, was second in individual performances by scoring 1 1/2 points. He won the high and low hurdles and tied for second with three others in the pole-vault.

Byrd of Milford, Ill., was the individual star of the meet, as he scored 13 1/2 points by his own individual efforts. He won the shot-put and the discus throw, and for first with two others in the high jump. Woodbury, Central High, Kansas City, was second in individual performances by scoring 1 1/2 points. He won the high and low hurdles and tied for second with three others in the pole-vault.
