no chance for an education. "The cigar industry in Tampa, Key West, and to a lesser degree in Richmond, Petersburg and Danville, Virginia, employs a large number of children. In Tampa alone the number of children under 14 increased in two years from a few score to over a thousand. Formerly, only Spanish and Cuban children were employed, but now a great number of the native white people of Florida have moved to Tampa that their children may learn this trade. The inevitable effect will be the lowering of the wage scale in what is now a high-waged industry.

"The students of the child labor problem know that the cotton mill has always been cursed with child labor and its natural accompaniment of long hours and low wages. On account of non-enforcement of laws themselves defective, southern cotton mills are conspicuous for the employment of children.
