Banister, chief surgeon of the Department of the Missouri, has completed the medical and sanitary inspection of Forts Crook and Omaha. He reports the health of the troops at each of the posts in the best of condition.

AUSTIN MAYOR DIES HERE Minnesota Man Brought to Omaha for Treatment Unable to Defeat Disease. George Henry Sutton, mayor of Austin, Minn., died of pneumonia at the Omaha General Hospital Thursday morning. He came to Omaha about two weeks ago for special treatment, his nerves, among other things, having been affected. He was 43 years of age and his wife and three children survive him.

DUNN IS OUT OF DANGER Police Captain Improving at Hospital—Assistant Postmaster Woodard Up and About. Police Captain Henry W. Dunn, who underwent an operation for peritonitis, is now reported as being beyond danger from complications and set back. He had a relapse one night of a severe intestinal storm, but is gaining now. Assistant Postmaster J. I. Woodford, who was operated on for appendicitis June 15, is convalescing at his home. He was taken out of the hospital for about a week and is able to walk. He expects to take up his duties in the postoffice within a week or ten days.

BOGUS BILLS FLOAT IN WEST Several New Counterfeits Have Been Discovered by Government. DESCRIPTION OF EACH GIVEN Men Who Handle Money Are Warned to Look Out for These Spurious Bills that Are in General Circulation.

Several new counterfeit bills have been discovered in the west and handlers of money are cautioned to be on the lookout for them. One of the counterfeiters is a silver certificate of the series of 1897, it is a photomechanical reproduction, very deceptive, except that the Indian head portrait differs from that on the genuine. The back of the note is of a lighter shade of green than the genuine. Red and blue lines have been printed or written in to imitate the silk fiber in the genuine.

Another bogus bill is a national bank note on the National Union Bank of Baltimore, Md. Series of 1875. It is a skillfully executed pen and brush reproduction of the old national bank issues. The paper has been colored and dyed in such a way that the note is very deceptive. A \$2 silver certificate of the series of 1890 contains the list. It is a photomechanical reproduction. It has no check letters and is printed on one piece of paper—not deceptive.

JOE FOLK TO ASSIST IN PROSECUTION OF WAINWRIGHT Former Governor of Missouri Will Aid Circuit Attorney Jones in Boothe Case. ST. LOUIS, Mo., July 1.—Former Governor Joseph W. Folk said today that he had been "tentatively engaged" by Circuit Attorney Jones to prosecute Ellis Wainwright, millionaire lawyer, in the Boothe case. If Wainwright should return to St. Louis to stand trial on the charge of bribery in connection with the Burburhan boodle deal, he confidently declared he could convict Wainwright. "Circuit Attorney Jones has called at my office in the last week," said Folk. "He told me he heard that Wainwright was coming back."

MORE FOR NAVY THAN ARMY Thirty-two Recruits Enlist Here for Sea and Seven for Land in June. Thirty-two recruits were enlisted for the United States navy at the Omaha navy recruiting station during the month of June. There were 150 applications for enlistment. The rejections were largely from physical candidates under age, and for miscellaneous physical defects. Only seven men were enlisted for the United States army in Omaha during the month of June out of ninety-two applicants. The rejections were largely from physical and moral causes largely. Preference is given to reenlistments. The physical examinations of the army are becoming more rigid annually, and while it is the wish of the war department to enlist the different army organizations up to the maximum, the men must meet all the physical and moral requirements.
