CHECKS GO TO THE CITY

Certified Securities Deposited as Guaranty Property of Municipality.

WHERE THE CONTRACTOR FAILS

Decision of Federal Court in Fremont Case, Where John W. Turner Deposited Checks to Bind Public Works Job.

The United States circuit court of appeals has affirmed the judgment of the lower court that certified checks deposited with municipalities as a guaranty to enter into a contract in case such contract is awarded to bidders on public works, become the property of the municipality.

The decision is regarded as important because it establishes the validity of the use of municipalities to certified checks when given for the faithful performance of contracts after having once been awarded to the parties depositing such checks.
