

Omaha Is Again the Winner: Eighteen Innings Without a Run at Detroit; Abbott Is Defeated

OMAHA CONTINUES TO CLIMB

Grabs Another Game from Pueblo by Score of 11 to 5.

MAKES TWELVE STRAIGHT GAMES

Outcome of Today's Contest, the Thirteenth with the Hoodeo Number, Worries the Fans.

Omaha, 11; Pueblo, 5. An even dozen games won straight. Whether the thirteenth game will prove the hoodeo and break the splendid run which is being made by the Bourke family is a question which is now worrying the fans, but which will soon be settled by the remaining five games.

Galgano went in by Manager Walters to try to stem the tide which has been running all teams to bow before the superior prowess of the Bourkes. At the outset it looked to be all day for Omaha. The big pitcher started like he was going to do things. He struck out Fisher and then he struck out Pendry, the first two men up.

Omaha could do nothing in the first, but in the second the real business of the game was negotiated. Five runs were piled up in that one inning, which was just as many as Pueblo made during the entire game. Every man batted once except Schipke and he batted twice and got out twice.

With two out the Bourke family took up the business of the day, which was getting runs. Pendry sent two of the boys home with a single and then the two big fellows, Welch and Kane, were hit by Galgano, the drive into the ribs of the latter forcing Fisher across the plate. Then came the Willie Williams hit, which was swatted a swish which drove in Pendry and Welch. Thinking five hits was enough for one inning Sluiger Bill, who can hit it out of the lot when he wants to, subjected Omaha to an easy out.

Pueblo drilled again and made a run an inning for five different innings, but they never seemed to be in any danger of making a spurt for the game. Galgano pitched three balls and two three-sackers gave Omaha four more runs in the seventh inning.
