Wheat Prices Still Tend to Lower Figures All Along.

HEAVY RECEIPTS SURPRISE BULLS

Rains Over Corn Belt Send Down Prices with Sharp Turn—Bulls See Only Dry Weather for Hope.

OMAHA, July 26, 1909.

With cables weak and lower receipts heavily over the estimate, the crop and bearish and hammered wheat values still lower. Wheat is being received in the harvest season from the track and is of the finest quality, sentiment rules strongly to the bear side and as long as receipts continue liberal further declines are looked for.

Corn weakened sharply owing to general rains throughout the entire corn belt and the outlook is now very favorable. Bears were again hammering wheat and the heavy receipts and weak cables gave them more confidence and prices declined until these factors were taken into consideration as heavy there seems to be nothing to check the market. Cash wheat was off another cent today.

Rains throughout the corn belt resulted in renewed selling pressure and cash values suffered a loss of 1/2 cent. The market is generally good and a freer movement from now on is looked for. The distant futures are suffering the heaviest declines.

Primary wheat receipts were 1,340,000 bushels and shipments were 585,000 bushels against receipts last year of 1,735,000 bushels and shipments of 963,000 bushels.

Corn receipts were 600,000 bushels and shipments were 225,000 bushels against receipts last year of 440,000 bushels and shipments of 353,000 bushels.

Clearances were 6,000 bushels of corn, oats and wheat and flour equal to 153,000 bushels.

Liverpool closed 1/4 cent lower on wheat and unchanged on corn.

Alleged Murderer Gives Bond.

Swenson of Garfield township, Clay county, held for the October term of circuit court on a charge of murder, was released from the county jail last evening on a \$300 bond, his sureties being Messrs. D. M. Hagan, Harvey Gusterson and T. S. Salm, all of Vermilion. He was released on an order from Judge Jones of St. Louis Falls, who presided at the first circuit during the absence of Judge E. C. Tripp of Yankton.

Swenson is 72 years of age and is charged with giving his daughter-in-law poison, from which she died.
