

Omaha Makes It Four Straight; Philies Win From the Cubs; Hamburg Belle Lowers the Record

CLEAN ROW FROM LINCOLN

Omaha Takes Series and Wins Up Long Stay at Home.

NINETEEN OUT OF TWENTY-FOUR

Good Record of the Rourkes Against the Whole League—Away on An Eight-Day Trip.

Omaha, 7; Lincoln, 3.

Nineteen out of twenty-four. Such is the record made by the Rourke family by winning Friday from Lincoln, making it four straight from the Frohns. In the present series at home all teams have been met except Sioux City. McCafferty was chosen by Fox to pitch the last game, because of his prowess in winning from Sioux City earlier in the week. Fox said that he had to win at least one game of the present series, or the boys would be afraid to face the indignant fans at home. But it was not in the cards. A had inning gave Omaha three in the second. Lincoln tied the score in the first half of the seventh, but after that it was a pipe for Omaha.

Pa Rourke still occupies the manager's position on the bench and Hunk Frank, captain and manager of the Rourkes for three years, has left for his home in Los Angeles. Hollenbeck played in the outfield, but Pa did not know who would play there today, when the team meets Des Moines, and Hollenbeck is to pitch the opening game.

In the second inning Kane walked and Schipke laid a neat sacrifice down in front of the plate. Hollenbeck and Goding's single scored Kane. Lower struck out. Fisher beat out a hit and Gagner threw wild to first to try to catch him, letting Goding score behind Hollenbeck.

Hard Luck for Lincoln.

Three errors, two singles and a base on balls gave Lincoln one run in the fourth. Waldron opened with a single and kept on going to third when Welch booted it toward the club house. Thomas hit to King, who also threw wild toward first, allowing Waldron to score. Hollenbeck's single showed his fine Italian hand by catching Gagner napping at second, after he had made a hit and had gone to second when Kane fell down on Davidson's bump. Things looked bad when Mason hit a Texas leaguer back of third. There was no chance for Schipke to get the ball, and the runners started toward home. They had forgotten that little Bertie King was playing short. He went after the ball like a streak and made a most magnificent catch over his head as he was running with the ball. He then whirled and completed a double.

In the seventh inning Omaha looked dangerous again and Mr. Lower was getting his bumps. The first two men up singled. Mason died at second on McCafferty's attempt at a sacrifice. Hoggie landed a safe one, when Pa called Keely into the game. Green had scored, so that Omaha was one to the good when Keely's chonding in Fox beat out a punt on Keely and stole second. Waldron hit a long fly to Welch, on which McCafferty scored from third, tying the score. That was all for Lincoln. They had a chance to score in the ninth, but with the bases filled, Jack Thomas flew out to Fisher.

Omaha Keeps on Running.

Omaha scored two in the last of the seventh on Fisher's single, bases on balls to Pendry and Welch and Kane's well-placed single, which scored Fisher and Pendry. Omaha is away for eight days. Score:
