Active Market All Day, Due Entirely to the Buying In by Satisfied Shorts-Conditions About Perfect.

OMAHA. Aug. 5, 1909. Wheat broke again at the opening today, but shorts began taking profits and values allied sharply. It was an active market broughout the session, due entirely to the buying in by satisfied shorts. Reports from the northwest confirm the impression that conditions could hardly be more perfect. The firmness in corp was due more to the strength in wheat and the advance showed up an oversold market. There is little or no improvement in the demand. Wheat did not hold the early advance. wheat did not hold the early advance, owing to renewed selling pressure on the rally. The bulges are not sustained, as the bearish pressure is heavy on the perfect northwest crop prospects. Buying was entirely done by shorts, taking profits. Corn was strong and higher with the early advance in wheat values, but eased off later on the weak, cash demand, and heavy local receipts. The movement of corn is liberal, owing to the fine crop outlooks.
