Alberts for the New Banking Law

Attorney for the State Files His Brief with the Federal Court at Lincoln.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Aug. 6.—(Special.)—Judge I. L. Albert, attorney for the state in the defense of the banking law enacted by the late democratic legislature, has filed in the federal court his brief in reply to the brief of John L. Webster and William V. Allen.

In discussing the right of the state to limit the banking business to incorporations and the right to issue notes for circulation, Judge Albert said:

Counsel concede that the right to issue such paper is no longer a common law right, but one that rests on a grant from the state. Now we are already shown that that one of the essential rights which accompanies a right to engage in banking generally, that is, to issue a paper which is not a bank note, is the right to issue such paper. The court will take judicial notice of the fact that there is nothing in the federal constitution which prohibits the issuance of such paper.

In conclusion, let it be said that the right of the state to restrict the right to engage in banking to corporations is sustained by the decided weight of authority. It follows, therefore, that in order to override the will of the people, as expressed by this act, the court must not only hold against the presumption of regularity, but also against the clear authority of the state.

BOARD MAKES FEW CHANGES

Levy Cannot Be Reduced Because of Increased Appropriations Made by the Last Legislature.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, Aug. 6.—(Special.)—The total assessed valuation of the state, as reported by the county assessors, with the proposed changes by the State Board of Equalization, is \$395,014,906.

It is also probable that the board will not be able to reduce the state levy at all, owing to the increased appropriations made by the late economical nonpartisan democratic legislature. Under the law the board is compelled to make a levy for the general fund sufficient large to pay the expenses of the state and the legislature.
