STEEL CARS AND BIG ENGINES

New Equipment is Bought by the Northwestern Line.

COACHES WILL BE FIREPROOF

This Road Also Increases the Carrying Capacity of Its Freight Cars Fifteen Per Cent Per Mile.

Seventy-five new Pacific type passenger ngines have been ordered by the Northwestern for delivery during the next two or three months for use on all its through passenger trains. These large engines will be able to handle a loaded train of fourteen standard Pullman sleeping cars.

The Northwestern has also increased the carrying capacity about 15 per cent per mile of its freight cars by the purchase during the last twelve months of 8.000 freight cars of modern type and capacity. These will assist most materially in the heavy grain movements which are soon to start. The average of most roads is seven cars to the mile, but the Northwestern now has an average of eight freight cars to the mile. Fifty new heavy freight engines have been ordered to assist in the movement of all these additional cars, each with 2,500.00 a hauling capacity 40 per cent greater than that of the largest type now in use on the

line. The Northwestern has decided to replace its present passenger equipment as fast as 1,400.00 possible with steel cars and orders have been placed for 125 steel fireproof coaches, chair cars, parlor cars, dining cars, postal cars and baggage cars for early delivery, 300.00 These will all be equipped with noncollapsthis heavily reinforced steel frames with the most modern vestibules, high speed air 1,500.00 equipment and the latest improved draft

gear. The floors will be laid with a sanitary composition that adds strength to the car and deadens the noise of the trains. The 2.00 seat frames are steel and no combustible material enters into any part of the construction. The new equipment will be provided for all the through passenger trains.
