



Under the heading of "General Informaon," the calendar says the grounds and buildings of the university are distributed among three groups: The original campus s situated in Lincoln, with the main en rance at Eleventh and R streets, contains dateen buildings devoted to academic, law, edicine and engineering instruction; secnd, the university farm of 320 acres, two and one-half miles northeast of the original campus, containing nine buildings devoted to instruction in agriculture, home onomics and forestry; third, the medical college building in Omaha at Twelfth and Pacific streets.

The university library consists of \$5,000 olumes. These volumes are divided among main library and eleven department li raries. In addition to these the students of the university have access to the folowing libraries: State library, 65,000 volmes; Lincoln city library, 26,000 volumes; Nebraska Historical society library, 16,000 volumes; Medical society library, 1,300 vol-

The university is well equipped with labratories in anatomy, astronomy, bacteriology and pathology, botany, chemistry, civil engineering, electrical engineering conomic geology, geology, geography, me chanical engineering, mineralogy, physics psychology, physiology and pharmacology and zoology.

It has a large and efficient school orchestra, which presented several standard symphonies last year and gave twentysix artists' and graduating recitais. 
