Gain of Sixty-Four on First Day Over One Year Ago.

NO BACE SUICIDE IN FARNAM

Increases Noted in Sixteen Schools, While Decreases Are Shown in Seventeen, but Former Overlap Latter.

Only sixty-four more public school children enrolled the first day of school this year than enrolled the first day in 1908. The gain to enrollment is shown in sixteen cchools, while in seventeen schools a smaller attendance is recorded. In one school, Forest, the attendance was identical on the first days of 1905 and 1909.

First day enrollment in the Farnam school belies the census enumerators' work. Enumerators in this district turned in figures showing race suicide, but school attendance shows a gain of twenty-four in Farnam over the attendance of the first school day last year. The heaviest gains are made in Lothrop school, with eighty more children; in Saratoga, with seventy-three more; in Kellom, with fifty more, and in Windsor, with fifty-two more.

Mason school reports a falling off in attendance of forty-seven, Central of fortysix, Lincoln of thirty-five, Webster of thirty-one, Park of twenty-seven, Walnut Hill of twenty-six, Pacific of twenty-three and Columbian of twenty-two, with smaller figures in other schools.

E. F. Leary Trustee of Hanson Creditors

Attorney Elected by Claim Holders and Will Qualify in Sum of \$25,000.

Edward F. Leary, a young attorney, has been elected trustee in bankruptcy of the estate of Tolf Hanson by the creditors. His bond was fixed at \$25,000, upon the execution of which he will assume charge, relieving Receiver Euclid Martin.

About thirty of the creditors and their representatives were present at the meeting in the federal building, which was presided over by C. G. McDonald, referee in bankruptey. Buslid Martin, receiver of the bankrupt, was also present.

The creditors represented about \$60,000 of the claims against the bankrupt. But representatives of neither the First National bank, which is the largest creditor, nor b John H. Harte, holding a mechanica' lien against the estate, approximating \$20,000, were present.

Upon the completion of Mr. Leary's bond as trustee another meeting of the creditors will be called for September 28.

The Armour company interposes the ob jection that the B. & H. company has not complied with the government requirements that all fresh meats furnished the army must be subjected to government inspection in the abattoirs by the regularly appointed government inspectors, without reference to the inspections made by the purchasing commissaries of the army. The B. & H. Packing company of Leavenworth is an independent packing company, but the independent companies do come under the government inhibition of federal inspection.

The matter is now in the hands of the secretary of war, and a pretty war is liable to be instituted against the independent packers in the matter of government

Should the contention of the Armou company prevail it would shut out all independent packers from competing for gov-The independent packers are taking the
