

ROADS IN WAR OF SPEED

Union Pacific Meets Burlington and Gets It One Better.

EASTERN CONNECTIONS HELP OUT

Milwaukee and Northwestern Shouder Most of Time Cutting Between Denver and Chicago—Many Time Changes.

The Union Pacific has met the cut in running time announced by the Burlington between Chicago and Denver and has gone that road one better by speeding up the time of two of its trains, the change to be effective September 15.

A speed war was anticipated when the Burlington made its announcement, as it was known that the Union Pacific, with its double tracks, could make the time. The Milwaukee and Northwestern have relieved that road of most of the extra speed by hurrying up the Omaha-Chicago trains a couple of hours.

Train No. 1, the Overland Limited, will be one of the trains which will lessen its running time to Denver, but will make no change in its running time to San Francisco. It will leave Chicago at 7 p. m. instead of 8 p. m., as at present, and arrive at Omaha at 7:30 a. m. It will leave Omaha at 7:30 p. m., making a daylight run across Nebraska.

The southeast Overland Limited will leave Denver at 8:15 a. m. and arrive at Omaha at 11:30 p. m. It will arrive at Chicago at 12:45 p. m.

Other Trains Speeded Up.

The other trains which will be hurried up between Chicago and Denver are Nos. 11 and 12. No. 11 will leave Chicago at 1:30 p. m. and will leave Omaha at 4:45 a. m. and arrive at Denver at 4 p. m. No. 12, the eastbound train, will leave Denver at noon and arrive at Omaha at 2:45 a. m. and Chicago at 4:30 p. m., making the run in twenty-seven hours and thirty minutes. A local Omaha sleeper will be placed at the Union station at 10 p. m. for passengers for No. 11, and No. 12 will carry an Omaha sleeper in which the passengers will be permitted to remain until 7:30.

The running time of the through Portland trains will also be changed September 12, the trip to be made each way in seventy-two hours between Chicago and Portland. No. 3 will leave Chicago at 10 a. m. and arrive at Omaha at 1:45 p. m. and arrive at Portland at 8 a. m. No. 6 will leave Portland at 6:45 p. m., arrive at Omaha at 7 a. m. and arrive in Chicago at 8:45 p. m. These changes will put the Overland Limited and No. 6 through Omaha at 1 o'clock in the morning.

Cows Play Golf at Country Club

McShane Leases Ground to Dairymen and Clubmen Sue for Injunction to Bind Lease.

As an aftermath of the Country club imbroglio with the pro-golf and anti-golf members opposed, the attorneys for the Country club have enjoined John A. McShane from taking possession of the forty acres adjacent to the Country club grounds and the locks and fences shutting off this tract have been removed.

Mr. McShane, who is also a member of the Country club, insists that the lease held by the club on this forty acre tract has been forfeited, to which the club takes exception, claiming that the lease on the tract runs to 1915. In the meanwhile Mr. McShane has leased the forty acre tract to a dairyman named Gaylord and Gaylord has taken possession and turned his cows into the tract and the bovines are now playing golf there, to which the Country club officials strenuously object.
