CURTISS AND WRIGHT MEET

Aviators Talk Shop in Shed of Latter at Governors Island.

PLANS FOR BIG FLIGHTS

Curtiss Will Cross the Lower Bay and Circle the Statue of Liberty as First Event of Celebration.

NEW YORK, Sept. 22.—A flight from Governor's Island across the lower bay and around the statue of Liberty probably will be the first aviation event during the Hudson-Fulton celebration.

Mr. Curtiss said he had, and further plans were exchanged. It was while inspecting the grounds at Governor's Island with William J. Hammer of the Hudson-Fulton aviation committee that Curtiss made known his plan to fly around the statue of Liberty.

These grounds are great," he said. "They are a little rough for starting, but they are ideal for landing."

The machine which Wilbur Wright will use is of exactly the same dimensions as that which his brother Orville used at Fort Myer last year, in fact it includes part of that ill-fated aeroplane which dashed to the earth, causing the death of Lieutenant Selfridge of the signal corps.

It is not as fast a machine as the one which has been sold to the Dayton brothers to the signal corps, but it is capable of carrying two men and of making a speed of between thirty-eight and forty miles an hour.

Curtiss will make no flights in a wind of more than five or six miles, but it is likely that Wright may attempt flights in a higher wind if it is from a favorable direction.

Wright's contract with the celebration committee requires a flight of one hour's duration, while Curtiss has the option of making any flight which his judgment dictates.

SCHOOL TO TEACH BIRD VALUE

Huge Loss to Crops May Thus Be Saved—People to Be Shown Proofs.

NEW YORK, Sept. 6.—To save the natural wealth of America by educating its people regarding the value of wild bird life, as the only sure check on the insect pests that are rapidly devastating the crops and woods of the country, is the object of a movement that was set on foot in this city today.

Headed by the National Association of Audubon Societies, a campaign is to be begun in every section of the country which is intended to result in the establishment of a national university devoted to the conservation of American resources through the preservation of the pest-killing birds.

Suitable endowment for an educational institution of such vital economic importance is to be at once sought, which is the intention of the proposed university, will be stationed in every section of the continent to present to the people proofs of their enormous loss in agricultural wealth due solely to lack of knowledge of the work done by the feathered insect-eaters, that nature intended to check crop plagues.

On the children of the land, who will face this most pressing problem when bird destruction has brought on an even more appalling spread of crop-killing insects, the Audubon officials declare they must base their hopes for the spread of the gospel of conservation on the bird reserves of the nation.

Trained teachers are to be assigned to conduct summer schools among the teachers of every region and through them to reach the great body of future American citizens.

The preparation and extensive circulation of illustrated, educational pamphlets on the economic uses of wild bird life is designed to be one of the chief activities of the new national institution, as it is of the National Association of Audubon Societies at present.

Text books treating of all the local wild birds will be published and issued to every school.

"Nothing but the education of the American people on the value of the wild birds as crop and forest preservers can now avail to ward off the impending agricultural devastation of this land," said William Dutcher, president of the National Association of Audubon Societies, at its headquarters, 141 Broadway.

"If some one or more persons of wealth desire to bestow upon their country the greatest possible benefaction, now and for all time, no better way could be devised than to endow such a national university on conservancy through bird life as we have proposed. We shall exert our best efforts to procure this extension of the educational work that we have been pushing for years."

WATERWAYS COMMISSION INSPECTS FRENCH STREAMS

Members Say They Have Acquired Much Information of Use to Them.

PARIS, Sept. 22.—The members of the American Waterways commission arrived today from Brussels and are planning to spend five of the nine days they will remain in France in examining the River Seine and other typical French waterways from the standpoint of navigation.

Senator T. E. Burton of Ohio said today that the commission had obtained information which would be of immense value in the development of waterways in the United States. The Department of Commerce of the French government has placed a representative at the disposal of the commissioners.
