HOLMES HIMSELF KING BATTER

DES MOINES is once more the champion of the Western League. It won the 1909 pennant after a desperate fight, a fight that lasted up to the last inning of the last game played between Omaha and Sioux City in Omaha.

Kane and King Are the Only Omaha Men Who Pass the .300 Line with the Big Stick for the Entire Season.

Western League Leaders. Batting—Ducky Holmes, 38; Kane—Smith, Sioux City, 15; Hilt—Jones, Denver, 19.

Ducky Holmes was not far off when, after his team lost the pennant, he declared that it was the best team in the league, as it led in every department, and it did not lead in every department, though in nearly every one.

Holmes King Slugger. The percentage shows Ducky Holmes led the league in batting with an average of .348. Of course Ducky was not a regular this season, only being at bat 138 times, while some regulars were there over 600 times.

Omaha finished with two .300 hitters, Kane and King, .307 and .292 respectively. Fisher, after the grand slugging he did earlier in the season, wound up with .283 and Welch .279. Omaha closed with a good team batting percentage, .334.

The records here show one little thing that ought not to be overlooked. Smith of Sioux City was the most assists and yet the most errors, or tied with Coligan of Des Moines. This is but another argument that the record player, which these men are not, is not the best player.

So far as pitchers are concerned, Lang of Des Moines will be generally regarded as the king, though Olmstead of Denver surpassed him in the percentage column. In this department is where both Omaha and Des Moines suffered.

Omaha was strong in base running. Fisher, Pendry, King and Fox were among the thirteen best and also strong in sacrificing, with Pendry, Fox, Welch and Kane among the thirteen best.
