BUYS LOTS FROM BRANDEISES

Walter H. Seely, Manager, Says Operations for Fireproof Building to Be Done February 1 Will Start Soon.

The new William Morris theater building will be located at the northeast corner of Eighteenth and Douglas streets, the old Hasscom horiestead, according to an announcement made by Walter H. Seely, vice president and general manager of the western corporation of the company. Mr. Seely Thursday morning closed a deal with J. L. Brandels & Sons for the

old Hansoom property.
"We will begin moving the houses Mon-day," said Mr. Seely and the work of excavating will start within a few days. We expect to be in the building by Feb-

The price paid for the lot is said to be closs to \$100,000; Mr. Seely said the total investment of his company would amount to about \$250,000. It is the intention to cut the terrace down and bring the theater entrance to street level.

"The new theater," says Mr. Seely, will present a vaudeville bill of ten acts. We will put up a modern fireproof building to be used entirely for theater purposes. The building will front on Douglas street. There will be six exits on Eighteenth street and four on Douglas

The William Morris company operates twenty-one theaters in Europe. It also has houses in Boston, Toronto, three in New York, Chicago, Philadelphia, Atlanta, Memphis, New Orleans and Columbus, O. It is operating no houses west of Chicago at present, but will open up soon in Denver, Salt Lake, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Portland, Tacoma, Seattle and Spokane. Mr. Seely has already gone to Kansas City to negotiate for a site there.


