FELTON TO SPEND MILLIONS

Money Will Not Be Spared in Rehabilitating Great Western.

WEXT YEAR'S PLANS AMBITIOUS

Methods in Vogue Under Stickney Regime Will Be Bettered as the Rebuilding of the Road Goes On.

Within the next twelve months wonderful work of rehabilitation is slated to take place in the Chicago Great Western railroad. Between \$7,000,000 and \$5,000,000 is o be spent by the system on its lines between Omaha and Chicago and Chicago and the Twin cities.

Marshail Craig, local city passenger and ticket agent for the Maple Leaf route, says that the methods as well as the physical character of the road are to be changed. The stigms of the "rate cutter" is to be removed and the line will be operated in harmony with other roads running out of Chicago.

Through service on the Great Western between Chicago and Omaha began in January, 1904, when the local office was established. Through trains for the windy city and for St. Paul now run into the union station. The local service between Omaha and Fort Dedge began in August,

In connection with the rebuilding of the road in which millions of dollars are to be employed, it is expected that officials will endeavor to make the Maple Leaf, one of the "strong lines" between Chicago and

Among the changes to be made in the physical condition of the property is the laying of 22,000 tons of steel rails weighing sighty-five pounds to the yard. Thirty-four ocomotives of the heaviest type have been ordered for the freight service, 2,000 fortyton box cars have been provided, 200 steel ballast care and ten new passenger coaches ordered. Forty passenger cars and t,000 freight cars have been ordered to the thops for repairs at certified times in the luture. The block system of governing trains will be established all over the route as fast us it can be built.


