Money Will Not Be Spared in Rehabilitating Great Western.

NEXT YEAR'S PLANS AMBITIOUS

Methods in Vogue Under Stickey Regime Will Be Bettered as the Rebuilding of the Road Goes On.

Within the next twelve months wonderful work of rehabilitation is slated to take place in the Chicago Great Western railroad.

Marshall Craig, local city passenger and ticket agent for the Maple Leaf route, says that the methods as well as the physical character of the road are to be changed.

Through service on the Great Western between Chicago and Omaha began in January, 1904, when the local office was established.

In connection with the rebuilding of the road in which millions of dollars are to be employed, it is expected that officials will endeavor to make the Maple Leaf, one of the "strong lines" between Chicago and Omaha.

Among the changes to be made in the physical condition of the property is the laying of 22,000 tons of steel rails weighing eighty-five pounds to the yard.

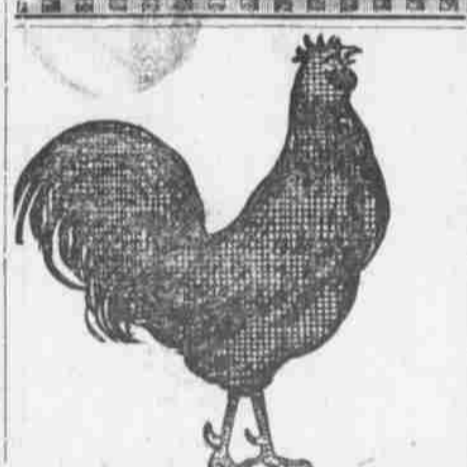

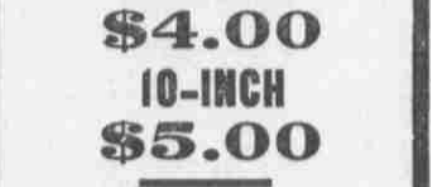

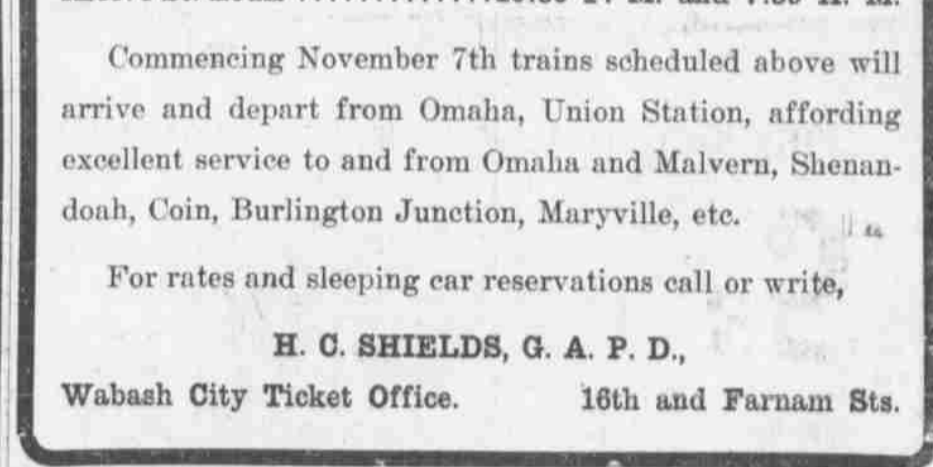
