PRINCE SUED FOR PART OF BRIDE'S DOWRY

Syndicate of Creditors Allege Financing Noblemen on Percentage Basis.

BUDA PIEST, Dec. 7.—According to the newspapers, a syndicate of creditors is suing Prince Miguel of Braganza, who married Miss Anita Stewart of New York at Tulloch Castle, Dingwall, Scotland, September 15 last, for \$5,000,000.

Some years ago, a paper says, Prince Miguel was in financial difficulties and the syndicate advanced a large sum, payable when he should make a rich marriage.

CUT IN NATIONAL BUDGET

Estimate of Expense \$103,370,303 Lower Than for Last Year.

FIGURES ARE REPORTED TO HOUSE

Reduction is Partly Due to Order of President Taft that Paving Must Stop—Total Amount Asked \$729,223,075.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7.—That there has been a careful scrutiny of the estimates of the appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1911, is shown by the figures submitted to the house of representatives Monday by Secretary of the Treasury McVehagh.

Reductions in Estimates.

Large reductions in the estimates are contemplated with the appropriations for the fiscal year.

In the Treasury department a decrease of \$12,000,000 for public works; in the War department about \$6,000,000 in the military and establishment, made up of decreases in the estimates for regular supplies, construction works for the army, mounted equipment, transportation, and manufacture of arms, and \$2,500,000 for public works, exclusive of the Panama canal.

In the Navy department decrease of \$25,000,000, due partly to the fact that Secretary Meyer has not asked for any money for new ships and that only \$1,000,000 is requested for armor and armament as against an appropriation of \$13,450,000 for this year.

In the Postoffice department a reduction of \$4,000,000 in the estimated deficiency in the postal revenues; and in the Department of Commerce and Labor a decrease from \$19,000,000 to \$16,000,000 on account of the thirty-third centime of the sea coast.

On the other hand, there is an increase of nearly \$18,000,000 for Isthmian canal expenses.

Money Asked by Departments.

The estimates in detail for the various departments are (cents omitted):

For collecting the corporation tax \$106,000 is asked. Total estimates required on account of the forestry service are \$6,428,700.

The total increase in Isthmian canal expenditures is from \$22,626,000 to \$40,623,254.

For public works under the War department the estimates include \$2,500,000 for the alteration and maintenance of the sea coast artillery; \$1,500,000 for sea coast batteries in the Philippines; \$1,000,000 for fortifications in the insular possessions; \$500,000 for store houses at Manila; \$125,000 for completing the military prison at Fort Leavenworth; \$200,000 to complete the army supply depot at Fort Mason, Cal.; \$200,000 for a cavalry post in Hawaiian territory and \$250,000 for the improvement of the Yellowstone National park.

The Interior department wants \$500,000 for protecting the public lands, and the attorney general \$200,000 for the detection and prosecution of crimes against the government and the investigation of the acts of officers of the United States and territorial courts.

Secretary Meyer has submitted estimates aggregating \$13,844,122 for new ships for the navy. They came in to late last insertion in the book of estimates laid before congress today and will be separately transmitted to that body by Secretary MacVehagh.

MATRIMONIAL BUREAU IN CLUTCHES OF LAW

Woman Who Swindled Nebraska Farmer Two Years Ago Fled Guilty to Similar Offense.

INDIANAPOLIS, Dec. 7.—Violet and Garnet Lancaster, mother and daughter, formerly of Evansville, Ind., whose "matrimonial bureau" caused an investigation by the police department in 1907, are in the clutches of the law. It developed Monday that Florence Alden, arrested Saturday and sentenced to two months' imprisonment for her failure to wed Herman Schroeder of Freedom, Okl., is none other than Garnet Lancaster. Her mother, Violet Lancaster, was arrested today when she attempted to deliver oranges, some of them filled with morphine, to her daughter in jail here.

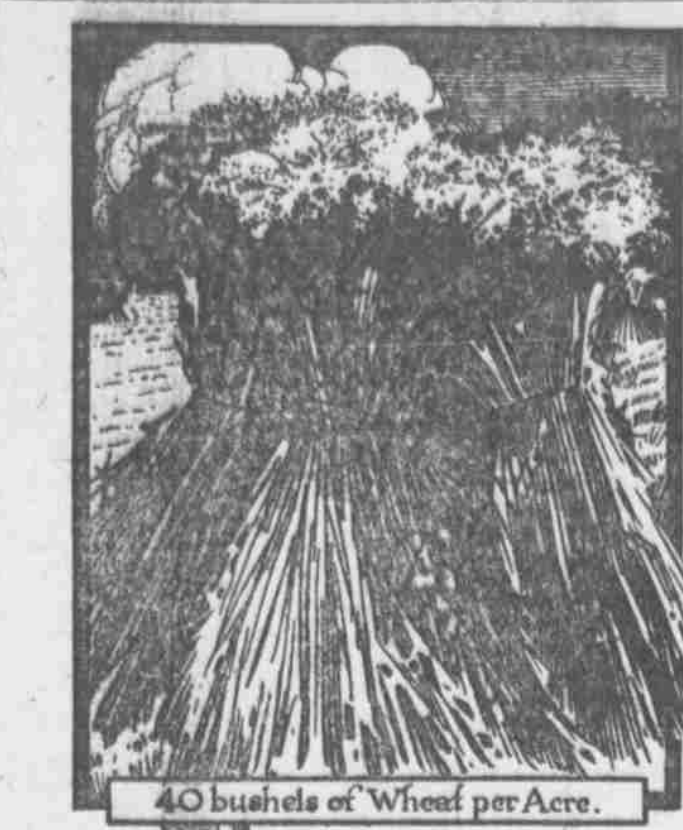
The Lancasters originally came to Grand Island, Neb., was fascinated by the photograph of Garnet Lancaster and advanced money by mail to wed the matrimonial bargain. When Garnet refused to marry him, Mischnick had her and her mother arrested. They were sent to jail, but when the daughter agreed to marry Mischnick, the two were released. Later the woman ches to complete their terms in jail. She was released and since has been living in Indianapolis.

The arrest of the girl was caused Saturday by Herman Schroeder of Freedom, Okl. who sees 200, expecting her to marry him. He arrived to perfect the wedding arrangements, but the girl refused to wed. She said she would rather go to jail. Her wish was gratified.

Today the daughter pleaded guilty to petit larceny and was sentenced to two months in the Indiana women's prison. Her mother is charged with aiding Garnet in her matrimonial schemes.

The police were notified by postoffice authorities today that the Lancasters are wanted on charges of using the mails to defraud.

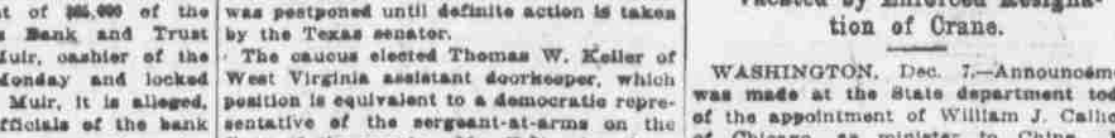

Robert D. Muir is Arrested

Former Employe of Lincoln Bank Charged with Embezzlement at New Haven, Conn.

NEW HAVEN, Conn., Dec. 7.—Charged with the embezzlement of \$65,000 of the funds of the People's Bank and Trust company, Robert D. Muir, cashier of the bank, was arrested Monday and locked up in default of bail. Muir, it is alleged, took \$15,000, but the officials of the bank obtained securities from him to the value of \$50,000.

Muir is 48 years old and has a wife and two children. He came here from Fort Jervis, N. Y., where he was cashier of a bank, but his early training was in a Lincoln (Neb.) National bank. While in Nebraska he was appointed an assistant bank examiner by the federal government.

Muir's alleged deficiencies were discovered in October, while he was on a vacation. He was induced to return and the shortage was made good by the directors of the bank. The arrest tonight was at the instruction of the State Banking commissioners.

Brown for a writ of habeas corpus to prevent their removal to the Omaha district for trial on charges of conspiracy in connection with the Mayray gang of alleged swindlers. They will appeal to the supreme court. The men were arrested in San Jose.
